## World Peace paper plate dove

Martin Luther King's message was always one of peace. A dove has traditionally been a symbol of peace.



### How to make your own peace dove

You will need:

- x2 paper plates
- Dove template
- Glue
- Scissors
- Brown pen/colouring pencil.


**Step 1:** Cut out the dove templates and place them on the plates. Draw around the shapes (aim to get your wing on the edge of the plate for a better effect!)



**Step 2:** Repeat the same process on the second plate. Make sure the doves are 'looking at each other'.



**Step 3:** Cut the shapes out



**Step 4:** Draw your dove's eye and beak. Turn over one of your doves and place glue everywhere except the tail. To make your dove more interesting, why not glue a twig with leaves between the two beaks?



**Step 5:** Place some glue where you want your wing to go and glue your wing to the body. Repeat to the other side
