UNIFORM

We believe that wearing school uniform promotes a sense of belonging and we insist that all learners wear their full uniform when attending school or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours.

Main School Uniform

- Navy school blazer with Wootton Park School logo.
- House tie (clip on).
- Plain white collared shirt – buttoned to the collar (worn tucked in).
- Navy school V-neck jumper or sleeveless V-neck jumper with Wootton Park School logo.
- School tartan skirt—to sit on or below the knee.
- Dark grey full length tailored trousers (not tight/fashion trousers).
- Grey/navy socks or tights.
- Belts should be plain black/grey/navy with no studs.
- Sensible black leather-type shoes (should be able to polish them), flat soled or heels no higher than 2cm. No trainers, high heels, sandals, boots or canvas pumps.

Outerwear

- In cold weather gloves, a plain scarf, woolly hat or similar, in a tasteful design may be worn to and from school but not inside the school buildings.
- The School advises that learners who cycle or scoot to school should wear cycle helmets and make sure they have some form of high visibility clothing or markings.

(Not Acceptable - tracksuit tops, hoodies, baseball caps).

All items of clothing **must** be clearly labelled with the learners full name.

APPEARANCE

Hair

- Hair should not be dyed using unnatural colours or be styled with flashes of colour.
- No shapes, patterns, lines or tramlines should be shaved into the hair or the eyebrows.
- Long hair must be tied back where likely to cause a safety issue. At all times hair must not cover an eye or eyes.
- Hair should be kept clean and tidy.
- Hair accessories may be worn if they are functional and not for the purpose of fashion. They should be subtle and in line with school colours.
- Hair extensions are not permitted.

Jewellery

As a general rule, the school does not expect children to wear jewellery. A small number of exceptions are permitted:

- Only one single gold/silver stud earring in each ear is allowed (no bigger than 5mm). No other visible piercings are acceptable.
- No other personal jewellery other than a wristwatch to be worn.
- Medic alert bracelets and necklaces may be worn and need to be visible.
- The only badges permitted are official school badges, such as Learner Council badges.

Make up

- With the exception of minimal skin tone concealer, make up should not be worn. This includes semi-permanent make up such as eyebrows.
- Nail varnish, false nails or nail extensions are not permitted.

ESSENTIAL EQUIPMENT

All secondary learners should, as a minimum, take to every lesson:

2 pencils (Art - 1 HB and 1 2B)

Coloured pencils (felt tip pens are discouraged)

30cm (12") Ruler

Scientific Calculator (Casio fx-85GT PLUS is recommended)

Please note that ALL equipment and uniform should be clearly named where possible.

PASTORAL SUPPORT

Moving to secondary school can be a daunting experience even for the most confident child. At Wootton Park School we recognise it can be quite daunting for parents also! Therefore, if your parent(s)/carer(s) have any concerns, worries or questions please tell them to contact us. Their first port of contact should be your form tutor. All staff can be contacted via their WPS email address, which is their first initial followed by their last name.

You will find out who your form tutor is shortly, but in the meantime if you have any questions regarding transition please contact our transition team on transition@woottonparkschool.org.uk.

You will be allocated to one of our four school Houses; **Red**, **Blue**, **Gold** or **Silver**.

The House with the most points at the end of the year wins the House Cup. Learners can gain house points through good behaviour and effort, as well as through inter-house competitions (e.g. sport). Rewards are also given out to individual learners who gain a significant number of house points.

If you have an older brother or sister at our school, you are likely to be in the same house as them (although this is not always the case).

- Always smile and say hello.
- Care for everyone and everything.
- Work hard, challenge yourself and have a positive attitude.
- Arrive to school and lessons on time every day. If you are late to school you should report to the main office giving your reason for lateness. If you are late for school with no valid reason you will lose your break time.
- Be calm, polite and respectful to all, both in and out of school. There is no excuse for rudeness, disrespect or insolence towards others. Racist, homophobic or abusive remarks and/or bullying behaviour will not be tolerated and will be dealt with severely. Any aggressive physical contact with another learner is normally dealt with by a period of exclusion. Severe instances of aggression, or repeated poor behaviour could even result in permanent exclusion.
- Wear the correct school uniform at all times. Outdoor coats and scarves may not be worn indoors.
- Respect the environment and do not litter.
- Be ready and equipped for learning.
- When your teacher or a nominated learner talks to the whole class, you are silent and concentrate. If the class is asked a question, you put up your hand to answer and do not call out. You work sensibly within your class and do not distract or annoy others. A request or instruction from a teacher should be carried out at once and without argument.
- Any home learning set should be completed and handed in on time.
- All learners are expected to move around the school in a controlled and considerate manner, keeping to the left on corridors and stairs, and carrying bags and equipment sensibly. You help by opening doors and standing back to let people pass.
- You do not bring chewing gum into school.
- You are not allowed to use mobile phones during the school day. If mobile phones are brought into school, they need to be stored in lockers throughout the school day. They need to be turned off and must not be used during break, lunchtime or until you have left the school site.
- iPods or other music devices should not be brought into school. If seen in class, or around school, the same rules apply as for mobile phones.
- Eating must be confined to the appropriately designated areas at break and lunchtime.
- You must leave the school premises by 4.30pm unless a member of staff is directly supervising you.

ATTENDANCE

Here at Wootton Park School we have very high expectations when it comes to attendance. We aim for every learner to have an attendance of 98% or higher.

When a learner falls below this threshold we wholeheartedly believe that this will begin to impact upon progress and attainment. The link between attainment and attendance is clear and we want all of our learners to achieve their full potential at Wootton Park School, which begins by maintaining a consistent level of attendance.

It is the legal responsibility of parents to ensure regular attendance of their children. All learners should be at school, on time, every day that we are open, unless the reason for the absence is unavoidable.

What happens if you are ill?

If you are really ill and unable to attend school, a parent/carer must call the absence line where a message can be left. To do this they simply call the school on 01604 931139 and select the option to report a learner absence. We need to be contacted on every day of absence.

If you feel very unwell during the day, you should ask your teacher if you might go to the main office to see one of the school's first aiders. You may not go home unless this is arranged via the first aider, your pastoral leader or a member of the school leadership team.

Absence for appointments

If you need to leave the school premises between 8.35am and 3.20pm, an absence request form must be completed by your parent/carer and authorised by the Principal.

Absence for medical/dental appointments will only be authorised for either a morning or afternoon session. Learners will be expected to attend school for the remainder of the day. Absence for a full day will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances. Evidence of appointments will be requested (e.g. appointment slip or confirmation letter). The school strongly recommends all appointments to be made out of school hours wherever possible, so that learning is not disrupted and attendance is not affected.

Family Holidays

Family holidays are not authorised during term time. Any learner who is absent from school due to a family holiday will be reported to the Education Entitlement Service who often decide to issue a fixed penalty notice. We advise that if there is a need for a term time absence, you contact the school as early as possible to discuss this absence.

Lateness

Lateness is a form of absence. If you are late for school with no valid reason you will lose your break time. Learners should be aiming to be at school by 8:25am to ensure they are on time for the beginning of the school day.
