Black Country Museum

Our year 8 learners enjoyed a fantastic trip to the Black Country Museum this week where they learnt about the history of the industrial revolution, visited shops and homes from the Victorian era to the 1930s and experienced what life might have been like down a mine!

Learners went to a Victorian school lesson which showed them how school has changed, saw the way of life of labourers, chain makers, hauliers, boatmen and miners, and considered how the role of women in society has changed over time.

They visited a narrowboat living quarters, a general store, a hardware shop, the old sweet shop, the Victorian fairground, a back-to-back terrace, a better off family home - complete with small holding, pigs and outdoor lavatory.

They played Victorian street games, saw vintage motorcycles, a limelight cinema, saw a working mineshaft engine, heard about the work of miners and saw the trolley buses and vintage cars still running today.

The learners were really immersed in the experience, asked insightful questions and enjoyed their day
