Thank you to Miss Walker for organising the trip and Mr Winchcombe for driving us



On Thursday 19th July, Laura Bassett, England International visited school and spent the day with learners.

Wootton Park School welcomed Laura Bassett, England international footballer, as part of the Mintridge programme. Laura started the day with a presentation to all the girls in Year 7 and 8, giving them an insight into her life as a professional footballer and what it has taken to play sport at an international level. She then ran coaching sessions for the girls and boys football teams and another group of Year 7 and 8 girls and the learners had opportunities to ask Laura questions and have photographs with her. The learners involved thoroughly enjoyed the sessions. In the afternoon, Laura visited the Primary classes, running a question and answer session and giving the learners an opportunity to hold and try on one of her England caps and hold her World Cup bronze medal. As part of the programme, Laura will now mentor Bella and Josie for the next 6 months and they will also get the opportunity to attend a National level football fixture. All learners involved with the day enjoyed the experience and we hope that it is a day they will remember for some time to come.

A year 9 learner celebrating success.

On Saturday 1st September, Will and his rowing team of U14 boys competed in the National Sea Cadet Combined Regatta in London. It was neck and neck at the end of the 3rd race and so went to a race off. The Northampton Boys brought home the silver medal and helped take the Eastern Area to joint overall regatta winners with Southern Area.

10 weeks ago Will had never been a coxswain; he is still to be assessed for his Supervised Coxswain qualification but has led the team through district to regional and now national. Parent portal on Arbor

Arbor is a great resource to view your child's timetable, track progress, checks clubs they are booked into and to update personal information.

All parents with parental responsibility will have received an email to activate and set a password for their account. It is advised that you access this on a desk top using chrome as the amount of data may be too large for smart devices.





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Absence during the school day

What to do for any absences

If your child is ill, please call the school and leave a message on the absence answering machine. Please remember to give the learner's name, class and brief description of the reason they are absent. After a sickness bug, secondary learners are to be away from school for 24 hours and primary learners 48 hours to try and stop the spreading of any germs. If a learner is unwell at school, they will be sent to the office. We will contact parents directly and ask them to come and collect their child. We ask that you try to book all doctor, hospital and dental appointments outside of school hours. Of course, there are occasions where this is not possible. If this is the case, please give the school as much notice as possible of the appointment by filling in an absence request form. These can be collected from the school office or found on the school website in the parent zone. We also require supporting evidence of the appointment such as a copy of your hospital letter or text message confirmation.

Medication in school

What to do if your child has medication

All medication must have a medication form completed and be prescribed. You can get the medication forms from the school office or on the school website. If your child has long-term medication such as inhalers, please ensure they are in school. Please note that we can keep one in the school office with a completed medicine form. Some secondary learners will carry their own inhaler. This is permitted but we still need a form completing and a record that they will carry the inhaler themselves.

If your child has allergies and has medication for this such as piriton and epi-pens, we will also need these in school. Without the paperwork, we will not be able to administer any medication. We can administer short-term medication such as antibiotics however only if it is prescribed and you complete our medication form. Unfortunately, we are not able to administer any medication without the pharmacy label on.

Please note that we cannot administer calpol unless the doctor has prescribed this. It is important that you make the school aware of any changes to medications/conditions so we can keep our records up to date.
