Remembrance – 1914-1918 World War I Centenary

Remembrance at Wootton Park School

Learners in Humanities Club looked at World War I to acknowledge the 100 years since the end of the war. Lessons and tutor time activities were linked to World War I and secondary learners joined Year 1 and Year 2 to take part in an arts and crafts session to learn about and make poppies.

The primary learners also learnt about peace and then wrote Poppy Peace Pledges. The secondary learners were excellent leaders and the primary phase produced some fantastic work and engaged well with the issues discussed. To officially mark this event, on Friday 9th November the whole school took part in paying our respects with a Remembrance Event at the Police Headquarters.
