
READING COMPETITION


A special mention goes to Lula who came 1st overall in the individual girls competition.

The Most Popular Book This Year


Epic Adventure (kind of) by Liz Pichon

INFORMATION UPDATE

As we are nearing the end of the academic year we would like to make you aware of some important information ready for the start of September 2021.

The asymptomatic testing programme is being paused for students in all secondary schools and colleges that will be closed over the summer holidays. If you or your child wish to access rapid lateral flow testing over the summer, you can continue to do so by ordering LFD test kits from GOV.UK or by collecting kits from your local pharmacy.

Lateral flow testing will restart on return in the autumn. Further information regarding this will be available on our website.

Arrival and Collection Procedures for the Primary Phase

Morning Arrangements

- EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 will enter the school via the primary entrance gate (Gate B), these classrooms are all situated on the ground floor. The gates will open at 8.35am and parents can escort children to the classroom. Classroom doors will open at 8.40am.
- Years 3, 4 and 5 will enter the school site via the secondary entrance gate (Gate A). The gates will open at 8.35am. Learners will line up in the main playground in front of their class teacher at 8.40am. Due to the line up taking place, parents will be unable to enter the playground. If you wish to speak to your child's class teacher, please send them an e-mail and they will happily arrange a suitable time to meet.

Collection Arrangements

- Dismissal of all primary phase learners will take place at 3.10pm
- EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 need to be collected from outside their classrooms. The primary gate (Gate B) will open at 3.05pm to allow parents on site.
- Parents from Years 3, 4 and 5 will need to gather at the secondary gate (Gate A) and learners will be dismissed from the playground at 3.10pm

School will be open as normal to all primary phase learners from Thursday 2nd September.

We are operating a staggered start for secondary learners, please visit out website for further information.


