A gentle reminder ...

With winter fast approaching there are many bugs around. May we remind you that any absence needs to be reported to school, please phone 01604 931139 and leave a message on the absence line. Please state your child's name, class and the reason for absence.

If your child has a sickness and diarrhoea bug please do not send them back into school before they have been clear of illness for 24hours for a secondary learner and 48 hours for a primary learner. This is to avoid spreading the bug further and to protect vulnerable learners.
